<b>Group:</b> Helmets, appropriate clothing, Tyrolean building equipment, Tyrolean instructions, buoyancy aids (venue dependent), Harnesses (venue dependent), Cowstails (venue dependent).					
<b>Instructor, dependant on venue:</b> Phone, first aid kit, group shelter, torch, hot drink, emergency food, whistle, knife, spare emergency clothing for group (cannot supply for full group, must have a some basics, EG: hats, gloves, etc..)

	Strangulation	All staff and participants	M	Appropriate group briefing. Constant observation of the whole group.	L
	Rope burn and grazes from the rope.	Participants	M	Appropriate group briefing, making them aware of it when they are getting on the tyrolean. Briefing of spotters so they can manage it.	L
